Revision Support Booklet – Trilogy

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1. General Information

All students follow the AQA GCSE Combined Science Trilogy specification. GCSE Trilogy awards on a 17 point scale, and students gain a double GCSE award. There are two tiers available. Foundation allows students to achieve Grade 1-1 to 5-5, Higher allows students to achieve Grade 4-4 to 9-9.

Each tier is assessed by 6x75 minute examinations, each worth 70 marks. There are 2 papers each for Biology, Chemistry and Physics. Within these papers students are assessed on their ability to recall content, and apply this content to unfamiliar contexts. They are also assessed on mathematical skills, and 15% of the examinations will assess aspects of the Required Practical Assessments (RPA's).

March Forecast Examinations

Students will complete forecast examinations within their Science lessons – teachers will advise of the dates of these for their classes.

GCSE Examinations

Paper 1 Biology – 15th May 2018 p.m.

Paper 1 Chemistry – 17th May 2018 a.m.

Paper 1 Physics – 23rd May 2018 p.m.

Paper 2 Biology - 11th June 2018 a.m.

Paper 2 Chemistry - 13th June 2018 a.m.

Paper 2 Physics – 15th June 2018 a.m.

In preparation for sitting these examinations all students should be completing a minimum 3 hours per week independent study(one hour per area), focussing initially on their areas of weakness identified from their November Forecast examinations and subsequently from areas of weakness identified from their March Forecast examinations. There are websites available to support students do this and the following pages detail some of the better ones.

All students should now have a revision guide – if your child does not have one please contact Mrs Peek as a priority. Workbooks of example questions are also available to purchase.

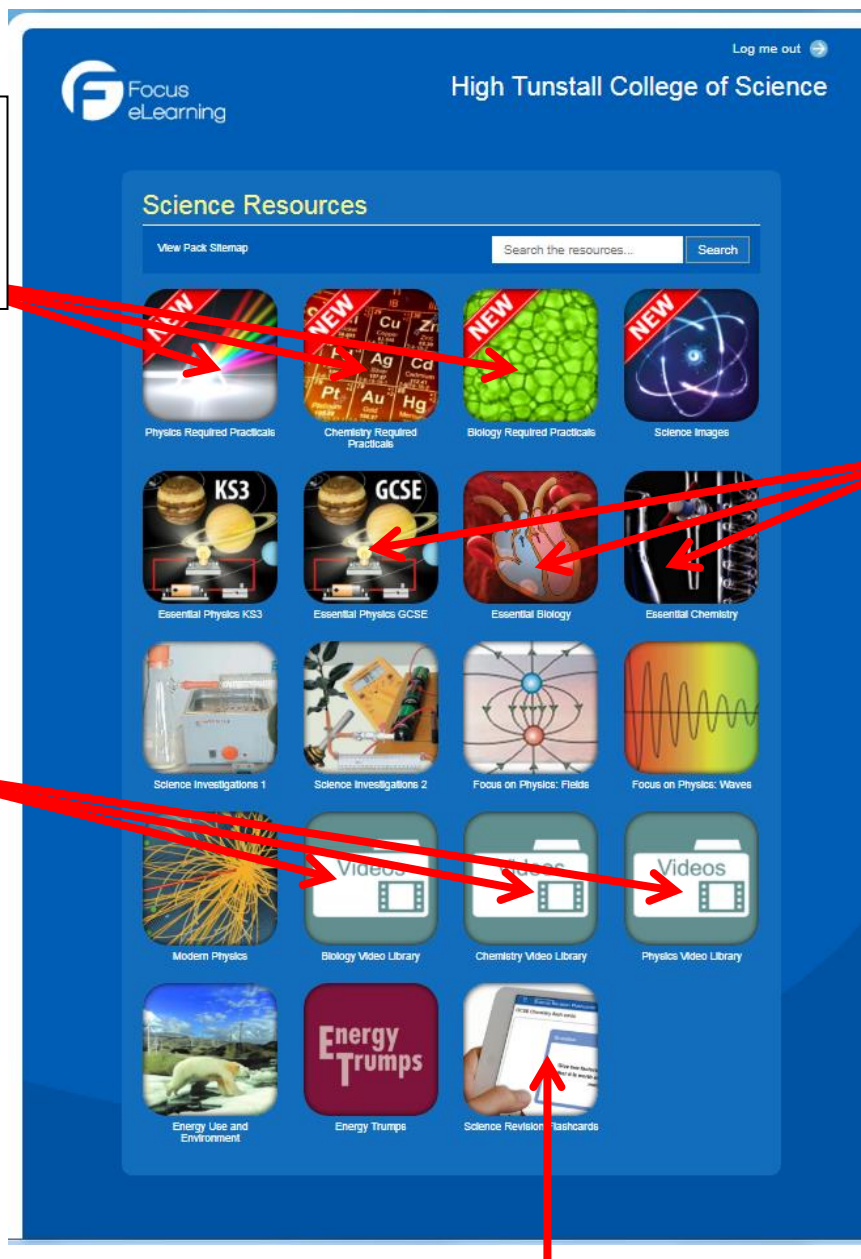

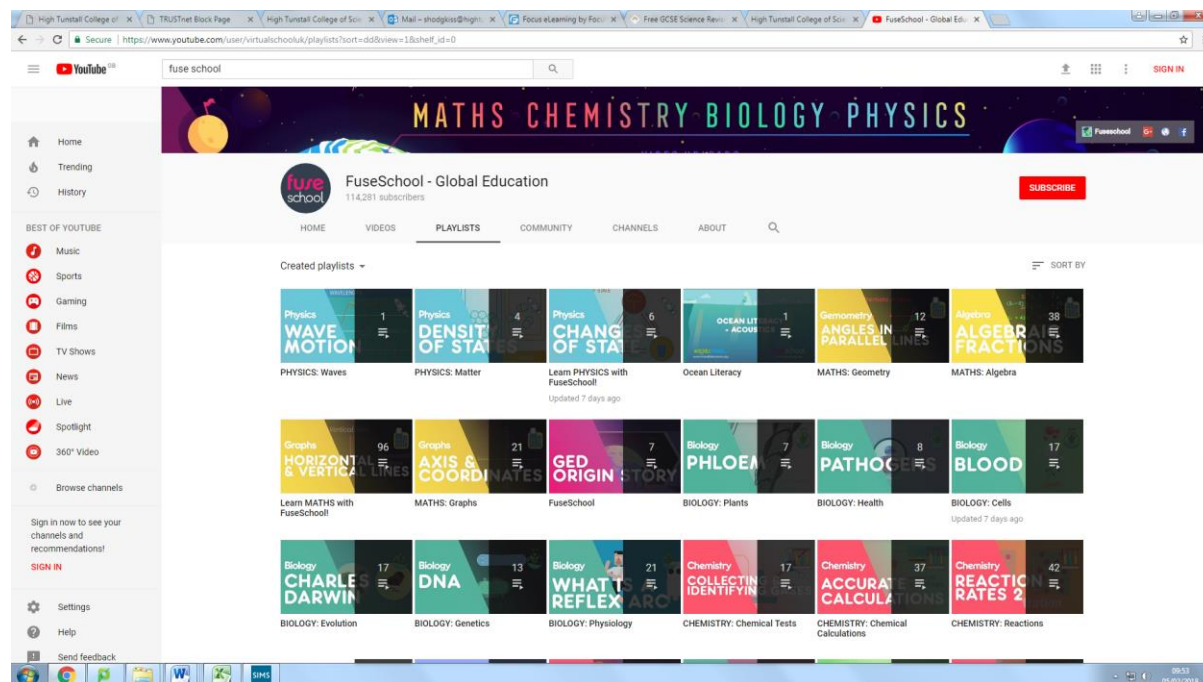

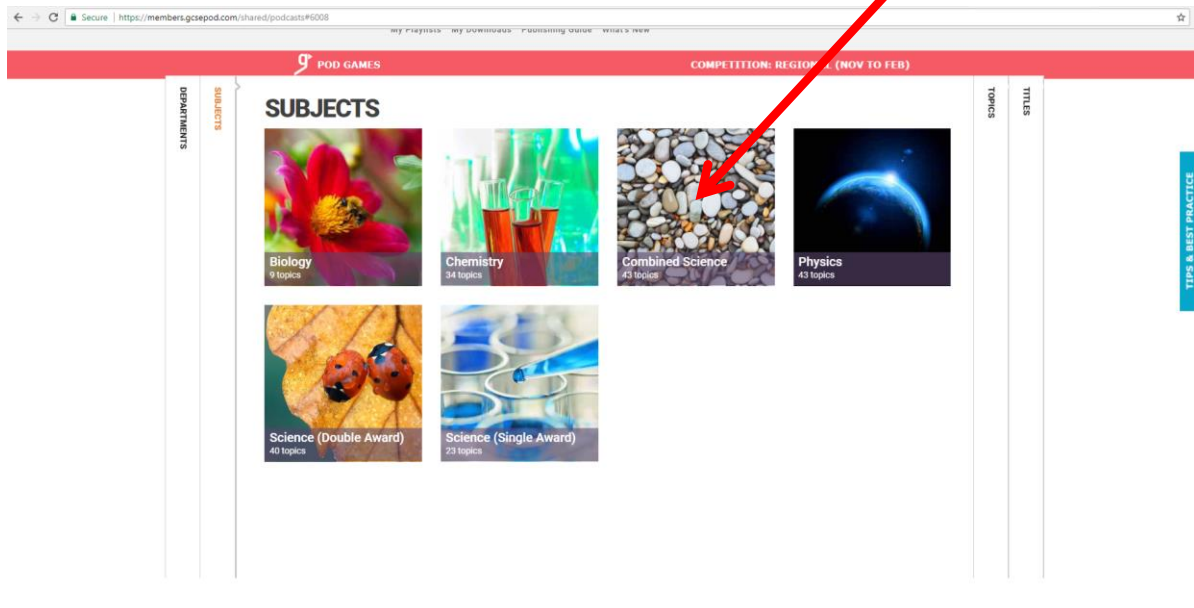
