Background to the Use of Biometrics in College

For the sake of clarity, biometric information is information about someone's physical or behavioural characteristics that can be used to identify them. There are many possible biometrics, including for example, a digital photograph, finger template, or hand shape. As part of our identity management systems, we will record a biometric measurement taken from a finger, but not a fingerprint image. The information is stored in a highly secure database and will only be used by the College to facilitate access to a service/range of services.

Our chosen solution allows us to use a secure database holding a minimal amount of biometric data to enable the use of a service/range of services.

The data is securely held on-site and cannot be used by any other agency for any other purpose.

The College will not use the biometric information for any purpose other than as stated above. The College will store the biometric information collected securely in compliance with the Data Protection Act 2018. The College will not share this information with anyone else and will not unlawfully disclose it to any other person.

Is there any additional information the college should tell parents?

Biometric data is stored in a secure database. The data does not include fingerprint images. The data is held as a short numeric code and is sufficient to recognise someone in a school community, but cannot be used to uniquely identify someone from a much larger population. The data cannot be accessed on any computer other than the college's licensed server. Thus data backups do not contain data that can be used outside the college. In short, the data is of no use to any third party and cannot be used to recreate a fingerprint image.

Current Legislation – The Protection of Freedoms Act 2012

This legislation requires schools to:

- Inform parents/carers about the use of the biometric systems in the school and explain what applications use biometrics.
- Receive written permission from one parent/carer for the school to process biometric information for their son/daughter.
- Allow children to choose an alternative way of being identified if they wish.
- Children under 18 who do not have permission will not be able to use existing or new biometrics when using services in the College.

If you do not wish your son/daughter to use the biometric system or your son/daughter chooses to use an alternative form of identification we will provide reasonable alternative arrangements that allow them to access current and future services.

Should you agree to the processing of your son/daughter's biometric information, it is important that you return the signed consent form attached as soon as possible. Please note that when he/she leaves the College, or if for some other reason he/she ceases to use the biometric system, his/her biometric data will be permanently deleted.
