Prior to school – what do I need to bring

You are not required to wear uniform for this term when you come in (and this should be cleaned when arriving back home). You should bring equipment or use that provided but this should not be shared with others and should be 'wiped' clean at the beginning and end of the session. You can bring a bottle of water but no food.



Entry into Tunny and movement around

The first thing you need to do on entry is adhere to signage and floor distancing signs and line up outside the east or west student entrance distanced from others by two metres. You may not enter the building until your designated member of staff meets and greets your group.

Enter via the student entrances on the east or west staircases as designated to you prior to your session **and it is essential that you hand-sanitise on entry.**



Please note the signs both on the floor and walls for your distancing and protection.

You will be escorted to the classroom once all in your group have arrived. You all must socially distance at all times. Groups have staggered start times and there will only be 6 in your bubble group.



You will always walk from east to west following signs, when moving around the college to your classroom to avoid any passing in corridors.

Your school lockers are not available for access. You should not touch any objects such as door handles. You do not have access to the Heart also.

The journey to Tunny

Walking – If walking to College, students should walk with someone but please avoid groups and stay a safe 2 metre distance from others coming in.

Driving – When driving students to school please drop off as normal and you should not drop off in the small carpark by the main entrance. Please use the main carpark.

Public Transport – If deemed necessary, you should socially distance from any other person and avoid hand contact with anything. **You are required to wear a face covering.**

Cycling – If cycling you should take care to distance yourself when cycling in and avoid groups. Please lock your bike securely to the railings outside the east or west door depending on where you are entering.

Learning at Tunny

Classrooms have been set out for small numbers of 6 students as seen in the image, to maximise social distancing. Only a designated staff member will escort the students (as a bubble), out of the building during that time and day. Classroom doors and windows will be open at all times for your ventilation.

Hygiene and Toilets

Other key information

If you require first aid this cannot be administered in the normal manner. There will always be first aiders on hand but they will be wearing PPE, so please be aware of this. We also have a set protocol if someone in college displays symptoms and if you would like a copy of this please contact the school. Finally, other key worker children and vulnerable students may be attending but they will be educated separately from your group.
