



Visitor Privacy Notice

This Privacy Notice has been written to inform visitors of High Tunstall College of Science about how and why we use your personal information each time you visit the site. This privacy notice is aimed at occasional and professional visitors to the college, who are required to sign in using the college's visitor's system.

Who are we?

High Tunstall College of Science is a 'data controller' s defined by the UK GDPR. This means that we determine the purposes for which your personal data is processed and how it is processed. We will only collect and use your personal data in ways that are compliant with data protection legislation.

We have appointed Veritau Ltd as our Data Protection Officer (DPO). The role of the DPO is to monitor our compliance with the UK GDPR and the Data Protection Act 2018 and advise on data protection issues. The categories of information that we collect, hold and share include the following:

- Name
- Company details (if appropriate)
- Purpose of visit
- Contact details (email address, telephone number)
- Car registration number (if appropriate)
- Photo and CCTV footage
- DBS Number and issue date.

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We may also process certain 'special category' data about our visitors including:

- Disability, health and access requirements.

No special category data will be specifically recorded and processed against your visit. However, there is a risk that some special category data will be captured in photographs & CCTV footage taken.

Why do we collect your personal data?

We use the information we collect:

- To meet statutory obligations for Safeguarding our students
- To ensure a safe and secure environment for all staff and visitors
- To meet our statutory obligations for Health and Safety
- To identify you and safely evacuate the college in the event of an emergency.

What is our lawful basis for processing your personal data?

Under the UK GDPR, it is essential to have a lawful basis when processing personal information. We normally rely on the following lawful bases:

- Article 6(1)(c) - legal obligation
- Article 6(1)(e) - public task

There may be occasions where our processing is not covered by one of the legal bases above. In that case, we may rely on Article 6(1)(f) - legitimate interests. We only rely on legitimate interests when we are using your data in ways you would reasonably expect.

If we share your information in a health emergency, we may rely on the lawful basis of Article 6(1)(d) – vital interests.

Who do we obtain your information from?

Much of the information we process will be obtained directly from you. We will also process information received from:

- Your company or organisation.

Who do we share your personal data with?

We do not share information about you with any third party without your consent unless the law and our policies allow us to do so.

Where it is legally required, or necessary (and it complies with data protection law) we may share personal information about you with:

- Local authority – if we have any concerns over safeguarding
- Suppliers and service providers – to enable them to provide the service we have contracted them for, such as our visitor management system (InVentry)
- Police forces, courts – to assist them discharging their legal duties
- Emergency Services – to ensure the safety and welfare of visitors and to meet any legal obligations
- Insurance – to defend a legal claim or record an accident/incident.

How long do we keep your personal data for?

The college will retain your information in accordance with our Records Management Policy and Retention Schedule. Statutory obligations determine the retention period for most of the information we process about you. Any personal information which we are not required by law to retain will only be kept for as long as is reasonably necessary to fulfil its purpose.

We maintain a visitor management system to store personal information about all visitors. The information contained in this file is kept secure and is only used for purposes directly relevant to work with the college. CCTV footage is deleted after thirty (30) days.

Artificial intelligence (AI)

We may use some systems and platforms that incorporate an AI function. Where we do this, we ensure that the data is held securely and is not used for training the AI model. AI does not make any automated decisions about individuals, and outputs are always subject to human oversight.

International transfers of data

Although we are based in the UK, some of the digital information we hold may be stored on computer servers located outside the UK. Some of the IT applications we use may also transfer data outside the UK.

Usually, your information will not be transferred outside the European Economic Area, which is deemed to have adequate data protection standards by the UK government. If your information is transferred outside the EEA, we will take reasonable steps to ensure your data is protected and appropriate safeguards are in place.

What rights do you have over your data?

Under the UK GDPR data subjects have the following rights in relation to the processing of their personal data:

- To be informed about how we process your personal data. This notice fulfils this obligation
- To request access to your personal data that we hold, and be provided with a copy of it
- To request that your personal data is amended if inaccurate or incomplete
- To request that your personal data is erased where there is no compelling reason for its continued processing
- To request that the processing of your personal data is restricted
- To object to your personal data being processed.

If we cannot resolve your concerns, then you may also complain to the Information Commission, which is the UK's data protection regulator. Its contact details are below:
